



What are our greatest strengths? ASD Department

What could we improve? ASD Department



- A clear understanding of whether parents or school need to provide specific equipment such as ear defenders
- The Introduction of breakfast or after-school childcare would be extremely helpful to our family as we both work full-time

What could we improve? Lower School



- I wouldn't say it was an improvement, but as my child has only recently come to Green Lane, we have never had experience of school pre-Covid. I am very much looking forward to being able to visit the school and have face to face interaction with their teachers and experience the school environment.
- I would appreciate more opportunities to come into school and do activities with my son.
- More physical activity for the kids. Some days our child barely moves at school. Less biscuits, we're trying to manage our child's weight and the biscuits he has at school don't help.
- I would really love some kind of parents' group. The mainstream school my other children go to has a WhatsApp group for each class. I miss being able to ask another parent, for example, if it's non uniform day etc and because we don't pick up and with covid, you never get to meet other parents.
- More notes and photos in school journal.
- More school trips and outings into the community, although these do seem to have picked up again. Parent's evenings start and mid year (as opposed to start and end of year), so can discuss progress and strategies whilst still time to make changes in that school year.

What could we improve? KS3



- Contact levels within the school, being able to visit! Face to face!
- Open evenings should not be just a quick phone call. They should be in school in the evening so we can actually see what the school is like and speak face to face with staff and teachers.
- Better explanation of assessment system used. Better explanation of individual progress on activities on evidence for learning though we appreciate this takes more time so would rather have the regular photos we have without this rather than fewer if that was the outcome.
- To share work/books with parents. Only work we've seen has been online.
- I don't have Microsoft Word so cannot open attachments on emails. I have to ask my husband to open them on his work iPad. PDF files would be preferable.
- As a parent who doesn't take their child to school it can be very lonely at times not having other people to talk to and we miss the opportunity to meet like minded people. A parent meet up group at the school would be nice for those who do want to get together and meet new people, it doesn't have to be too often, possibly just every month. Also Involving the parents in some of the school activities would be nice and also exciting for our children, It would also make us feel more comfortable when we do visit the school.
- Checking the website for information can also be a challenge, especially when you've had a busy day, it's easy to forget to do. It would be nice in the future to have a Social media group or page that parents can share information / about clubs and general info from the school. This seems to be popular with lots of other schools and it would also help for us not to miss out on anything of importance.

What could we improve? KS4



- Explaining what the numbers are on my child's IEP and explaining what level they are working to/towards.
- Car parking for parents.
- Nothing I can think of other than it would be brilliant if they could stay there until they are older as I fear when they leave it will be a struggle for the change and having no friends .
- More parental involvement with regards to being part of the school. will often talk about places around school and I have no idea what she is talking about as I haven't been physically in the building for so long. will often talk about TAs who are in her class but I have never met them. I believe my daughter has a new teacher but I have never met her. More educational visits. ... loved going shopping to Asda.

What are the 3 most important issues we should address in the next year? ASD Department

- More opportunities for parental involvement within the school/ face to face parents' evenings. Providing learning opportunities that have been unable to happen due to covid. Continuing to make sure the children feel safe and happy.
- Reintroduce the wider curriculum- e.g. shopping in the community, swimming. Support for working families via wrap around care. Possible holiday clubs.

Any other comments?




- Well done to all x
