#### Pupils are:


- Offered a broad and balanced timetable;

# Achievement & Standards

The curriculum model is currently divided into five areas:

Modified National Curriculum. All pupils have access to this curriculum within their class / year group. This includes literacy and numeracy lessons and other core foundation subjects including French as a modern foreign language. The curriculum offered is referenced to pupils preferred learning styles. All pupils have an Individual Education Plan that is evaluated each term.

**ASD Curriculum.** This curriculum delivery is highly specialized for pupils who have social and communication disorders and who are on the autistic spectrum. The Individual Education Plans have targets that include:

- Communication
- · Flexibility of thought
- Social interaction
- Behaviour and sensory integration

**Nurture Group.** Nurture group provides a flexible and preventative resource that is responsive to the needs of particular children attending the school.

Within the nurture group there is a secure and reliable environment for children showing signs of emotional stress and behavioural difficulties.

The nurture group enables children to experience pre-school nurture from caring adults who work actively towards the children's successful reintegration into a class in the main body of the school.

Nurture group staff work in partnership with class teachers, teaching assistants and parents to enable consistency of approach both at home and at school.

**Functional Curriculum.** The functional curriculum broadly equates to those pupils with complex learning difficulties. This includes areas such as life-skills, language support, development maths, English and basic skills.

**Well-being**. Well-being is an integral part of the school. It encourages and nurtures individuals to develop to their full potential. Individual pupils are identified as requiring extra support with their social and emotional well-being.



# **Every Child Matters**

**Enjoy and Achieve.** The school is a happy and purposeful setting where children are praised and acknowledged for who they are. Pupils enjoy coming to school and they are proud of their achievements and celebrate the achievements of others.

**Stay Safe.** We provide a safe, supportive and inclusive environment. We teach and encourage pupils to take responsibility for their own safety and that of their peers.

**Be Healthy.** We encourage all pupils to pursue a healthy and active lifestyle. We promote healthy eating through snacks and healthy lunches. Children are encouraged to be active throughout the day both in planned PE sessions, in the range of activities and resources available to them at break and lunch times.

Making a Positive Contribution. We believe that communication is the key to effective learning in all areas of curriculum. Children express their views with more confidence whilst listening to the opinions of others.

**Achieve Economic Well-being.** We aim for all our pupils to achieve their potential in every area of their learning. They practice their skills not only in the classroom but out in the wider community. They develop an awareness of what employment means and how to manage their leisure time through the development of interests and hobbies.
